## CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2006

The staff wages have been increased incrementally as in previous years. Because of financial restrictions, we have been unable to accelerate their rates of increase.

The carpet seams have been repaired and the shelf ends have been installed on the main floor. These two changes have greatly improved the appearance of the main floor of the library.

The Library computer-training program carried out by Kyle Harkiss continues to be very successful. We have to continue to find funding for this service to continue.

There have been two improvements made in the computer system. First, at the instigation of Chuck Perera, our former Systems Administrator, the Novell system with associated Linux software was replaced with a Windows system which is much simpler to operate. This new system makes a continuous backup of library data during operation. It is much easier to maintain which means that this work can be carried out by the regular library staff.

The second improvement was provided by the Manitoba Government. They offered \$15400 to every library in Manitoba to upgrade their computer equipment and software. We now have:

- A new server
- Three new computers
- One laser colour printers.
- Infocus LCD projector.
- \$4,500 which we intend to spend on a scanner.

As always, the Board is grateful to Phyllis and her staff for their capable administration of the Library.

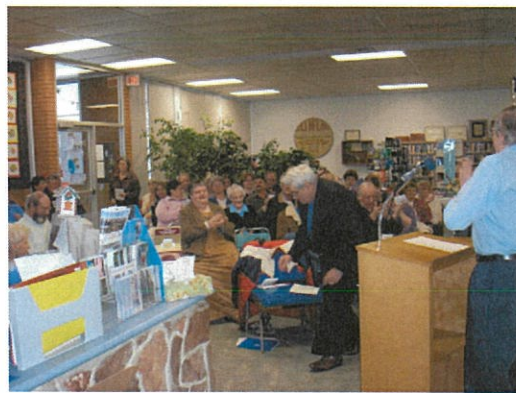

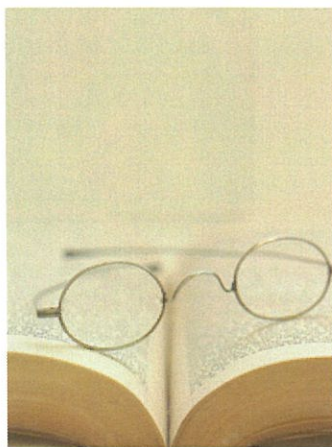

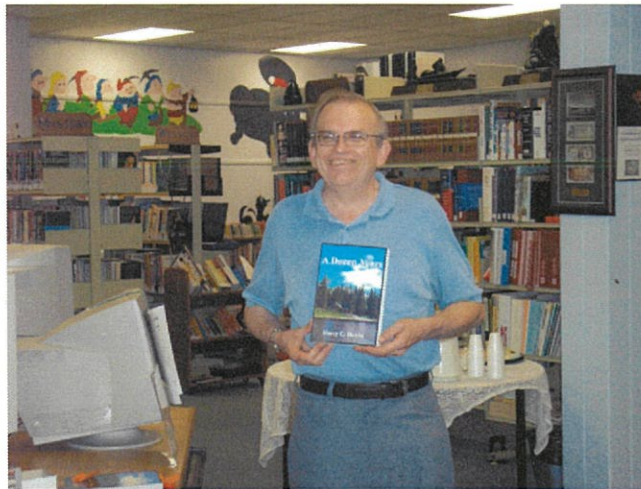
I attended the Saskatchewan Library Conference which was held in Regina at the Regina Inn from May 4-5, 2006. The conference theme was "*Libraries Value beyond Words*". The opening guest speaker was Dr. David Suzuki, which was well attended by conference goers and the general public alike.

Some of the workshops and special events included: "*Regina Public Library Reception Libraries: worth their weight in chocolate*", "*Enhancing Libraries on-Reserve through partnership*" with presenters Brenda Tenold a Library Consultant, Prince Albert Grand Council Education and Thorina Wilson the First Nations Governance Administrator. Also Ken Setterington a Children and Youth Advocate. The conference concluded with the endnote speech by Perry Bellegarde who spoke on "*Libraries-Linkages and connections to the Aboriginal Community* – this session focused on the need to strengthen linkages between libraries and the Aboriginal communities."

This was with the help of Chuck Perera who was our tech person while he attended high school. We also have gone wireless at the library now and have updated our library system from L4U to L4U Platinum.

Mr. Tom Goodman joined the Flin Flon Public Library Board in September, 2006 and Mr. George Fontaine was appointed City of Flin Flon representative in October 2006 after the municipal election.

Our entire Library staff attended the Public Library Services Conference which was from October 19-21<sup>st</sup> in Brandon, MB. We found the pre-conference workshop on L4U Platinum was very informative and answered a lot of questions we had. Some of the other workshops were, *Digital Audio Seminar*, *Shipping Tools for Library Mail*, *Best practices for Teen Services*, *Open Source Library Software*, *Using Puppets Effectively in Storytelling*, as well as *Strategies for the Future*. We found the conference on a whole to be so beneficial & a very nice opportunity to get to know other Librarians from all over.



We would like to wish Ken Kuryliw, a Consultant from Public Library Services the best of luck in his future endeavors as he has retired after 15 years of service. Ken we will miss you greatly, as you have been so helpful to us all.

A special congratulation's goes out to Carol Ham, Administrator of The Pas Regional Library. She received the "Citizen of the Year" award in the Community of The Pas, MB; know one is more deserving of this award. I was able to surprise Carol by attending the reception held in her honor.

In November an announcement was made by, "Culture, Heritage and Tourism" Minister, Eric Robinson. Manitoba's libraries were to receive funding to improve their technology services. The funding was in the amount of \$15,300.00, which our library used to update our server, purchase three new computers, a color laser printer, a LCD projector and we also updated some of our software.



In December we again ran our “Warm up Little Hands” program as well as “Food for Fines”. These two events were very successful, as we were able to collect 120 pairs of mittens and several boxes of food. Which were then donated to the Salvation Army, Elks Hall and the local Food bank, to be added to their Christmas Hampers. And this year all the Library staff & our Board members celebrated with a Christmas Party at the Victoria Inn, fun was had by all.

I would like to thank the staff for all of their dedication and hard work, and the Board Members for their continued support. I would also like to thank Kyle Harkiss for all of his dedication & patience he provided to his client’s during their computer training.

## Computer Lessons and What It's All About

I'm Kyle Harkiss and I've been privileged enough to have the chance to work here at the Library and with the public for a bit more than two years. What I mainly do is teach computer lessons to the general public and I love what I do. I get to meet a lot of interesting people and honestly spend some time getting to know them as well as letting them build a new skill. On a good day I'm teaching lessons to any number of people from any level of talent. A LOT of people come to me with the simple phrases "I don't even know how to turn it on." It's nice to see people taking an interest in something that's so rampant in the world....and it puts a nice perspective as to why some people don't. Busy lives, children, costs, work...sometimes interest is the last thing preventing someone from learning how to work with a computer. People like the flexibility we have here. You can schedule ahead and come as often as you feel comfortable with. It makes things a lot easier on everyone because it lets them work around their own lifestyles and take the time.

I have to say I enjoy the seniors the most. It's nice to see them come out and take a chance. It's nice to hear a lot of stories as well; it's always the seniors who have the stories. I think that's another large part of what I do, simple getting to know people a bit better. It's doubtful that every single person I work with will go home, surf up and down the web and be burning their own mixed CD's but there is that first step and sometimes that's enough. Being able to email family or even just to be doing something new and exciting. Whether it's the news or EBay that first draws a person in it's always just the tip of the iceberg. Once you start to showcase all that even an average computer can do it becomes not something that SHOULD be done but something that people WANT to do. It's convenient, it's handy, it's a nice way to waste time and best of all it puts you in touch with the rest of the world. True enough that some people only use this power to send joke emails and check the weather but the point is that they enjoy it and feel good about themselves for having been brave enough to try.

I hear that more and more. I never honestly thought about it but if you've never done anything related to them or even kept busy in the last ten years....computers are almost an entirely new concept. I was raised on them so it's always been a part of my life but that doesn't change the fact that from a world perspective the online world is still in its youngest stages. In that short amount of time they've spread across the world and now there isn't a single thing on the planet that isn't connected somehow. If you think about it like that then yes, it would be intimidating to sit down in front of an expensive piece of equipment that is supposed to 'do it all' and being let loose. There just isn't anything for the true beginner....even the "Dummies" books assume you have a lot of prior knowledge.

The course is fairly simple, we start in Microsoft Word using the keyboard and mouse to do simple tasks and that's more so to build confidence. Being able to create something



and then look at what a person has done even on their second day of work. After a few more courses on making simple documents we start to get into the fun stuff. Making T-shirts, email, the internet in general. After that most people have a good foundation, enough to take their first steps and try something new. Some people install a few games and other people get more into the entertainment side of things, working with CD's and whatnot. They get brave. That's the point. After so long and you realize it's actually quite hard to hurt or damage the machine they start to get into things THEY are interested in. After that....I get emails. Emails about what a program is doing or why this did that when it shouldn't have....minor technical questions mostly. The terminology isn't always right but I HAVE been amazed by the number of things people find. I think one of interest was a webcam aimed at an eagles nest. I didn't get to see if the eggs hatched but it was a live feed broadcast the world over just on this one eagle nesting. I've seen a similar thing shortly after about a watering hole in Africa. Things like this even I wouldn't have heard about and that's why I love to hear from old students.

I'm glad to have this chance to work with the public and help people in their daily lives, even if it's just computers. It makes a difference to many people and the sheer amount of people that know me as simply 'that computer guy' is amazing. I extremely grateful for having had the opportunity to be here.
