MESSAGE FROM LIBRARY BOARD CHAIRPERSON, BILL HANSON

There has been some debate of late as to whether libraries are an essential service or not. A library in a small community such as ours is indeed essential and is the heartbeat of the community for many, many people.

Our library along with many other libraries over the last couple of years have suffered due to the pandemic, and infrastructure problems within our facility. Operating with less staff and less money than previous years has proven to be a struggle and a challenge, but fortunately we have a staff that have stepped up and done an incredible job.

Public libraries are mandated to provide access to a variety of ideas, literature, and information. All Canadian public libraries follow the principles of the Canadian Federation of Library Associations position statement on Intellectual Freedom and Libraries. Intellectual Freedom is defined as the right of every individual to both seek and receive information from all points of view, without restriction.

The Flin Flon Public Library has gone through a number of administrators over the last five years and there were mistakes made and corrected. We are currently clawing our way out of a bit of a financial conundrum. I won't speak on financial numbers or readership as that will all be in the annual report.

When I visited the library yesterday, the one thing that I noted was the joy on the faces of the people as they walked through the door. The children who received their certificates for 1000 Books Before Kindergarten. The joy reflected on their faces as they meet this challenge is one that would almost make you cry. Many of them are so excited to start reading another thousand books so kudos to our staff for coming up with this program and for following through with it. Please support your local library it's an essential and important part of our community.

MESSAGE FROM LIBRARY ADMINISTRATOR, LISA SLUGOSKI

2022 was a year of getting back to a new normal at the library. In 2021, the library had 4,304 visitors, and in 2022, we welcomed 7,770 visitors. We hope to continue this upward trend in library visits in 2023.

Looking for new ways to engage patrons was a priority in 2022. The library hosted a 2022 Reading Challenge with monthly reading prompts, a Read-a-thon from February 11th-13th, and a Wine and Book Night for Culture Days in September.

Our children's programming was a success with the TD Summer Reading Club over the summer, as well as the ongoing 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program, which runs year round. The library also co-hosted Read-to-Me Family Literacy with the Community Adult Learning Centre. Read-to-Me is a literacy program including stories, crafts, and play for 2-5 year olds to attend with a caregiver.

In November, the City of Flin Flon closed the library building to staff and the public while waiting for an engineering assessment of the roof. Structural deficiencies were noted in the assessment, and the building remained closed to staff and the public for a total of 62 days while repairs were made. The final repairs will occur in 2023.

The saying goes that bad libraries builds collections, good libraries build services, and a great library builds a community. Our goal at the Flin Flon Public Library is to create a safe, welcoming space, where all members of our community are able to access not only books, but also inventive programming, wifi, public computers, and assistance with solving questions big and small.

Our library would not be what it is without the support from the members of the community we serve. I also have to take this time to thank my staff, because without their input, ideas, excellent customer service skills, and creative problem solving abilities, this library would not be what it is today. I believe the community we serve, as well as the library staff, are the key that elevates our library from good, to great.



PROGRAM FUNDING

NORTHERN NEIGHBOURS FOUNDATION

The Northern Neighbours Community Foundation provided grant money to the library to fund our home delivery program. through 2022. After the pandemic our home delivery service came to a grinding halt.

After speaking with the Northern Neighbours Foundation, the decision was made to allow the library to use the funds for our 1000 Books Before Kindergarten Program instead. This allowed us to replenish tote bags, certificates of achievement, reading badges, and purchase toy prizes for hitting each 100-book milestone.

We wish to extend our thanks to the Northern Neighbours Foundation for selecting the library as a grant recipient in 2022. Without the monetary support received from the Northern Neighbours Foundation, the library could not run programs such as 1000 Books Before Kindergarten.

THE WINNIPEG FOUNDATION

The Read-to-Me Family Literacy program runs in the library's Kinsmen Room. Adult Family Literacy provides funding for two days of Read-to-Me programming per week, for 24 weeks per year.

The Winnipeg Foundation's Literacy for Life grant allowed the library to provide funding for an additional day of programming per week, taking the program from 48 sessions per year, to 72 sessions per year. These funds allowed the program administrators to offer an additional option for attendance, while further promoting the importance of early childhood literacy.

We wish to extend our thanks to the Winnipeg Foundations Literacy for Life grant program for selecting the library as a grant recipient in 2022. These funds are necessary for the library to provide quality early childhood literacy programming.











NEW ITEM BREAKDOWN BY GENRE





TOTAL COLLECTION BREAKDOWN BY GENRE






HOME DELIVERIES




